Throughout the nation's history, the United States has defined itself through war and the continual				
reimagining of these conflicts in public memory. In this course, we will explore the construction and				
contestation of personal and collective memories of various wars from King Philip's War in colonial New				
England to the current War on Terror. Looking at memory will allow us to uncover struggles over ideas of				
liberty, race, religion, citizenship, civilization, and other key concepts that shape America's national				
identity. In order to better understand the workings of memory and its influence on identity, we will also
