This infamous date marks the deadliest terrorist attack in the last twelve years, and instilled a sense of urgency to governments worldwide to respond to the growing threat of radical Islamist terrorism. But before governments were able to create counter-terrorist strategies, they sought to definitively define terrorism in the hope such an act would categorically criminalize such actions. Together we will explore what isn't a terrorist, determine whether a definition of terrorism is necessary in international law, and what options the international community has for combating extremist group ISIS.
