AROUND THE SCAC

Centre advanced all the way to the SCAC Field Hockey Championship match with a thrilling 1-0 win against Rhodes in overtime. However the Colonels came up just short of claiming second ever SCAC Field Hockey Championship with a 1-0 loss to Sewanee in the Final. Centre finishes the season with an overall record of 12-7 and second place in the SCAC.

DePauw finished the season with a 14-4 mark and in third place at the SCAC Championship. The Tigers opened tournament play with a 3-2 loss to eventual champion Sewanee in the semifinal. DePauw held a 2-1 lead on the strength of goals by Meredith Ellis and Carolyn Mueller. Sewanee tied the contest with 9:41 left and scored the game-winner with just 3:54 remaining. DePauw outshot Sewanee, 26-12 in the loss. Mueller scored with just 1:07 remaining in the first half of the third place game and the Tigers held on for a 1-0 win over Rhodes. DePauw's 14 wins were the most since the 2000, the four losses were the fewest since 1999 and the .778 winning percentage the best since 1994.

Hendrix opened the 2008 SCAC Field Hockey Championships with a thrilling first-round contest against Sewanee-The University of the South on Friday. Playing through a steady rain and less than ideal conditions, it took two overtime periods and a shootout for Sewanee to defeat Hendrix 3-2 in strokes. Hendrix ended only its second season of field hockey with a 4-11 record and 1-7 SCAC mark. The Tigers jumped on the scoreboard first as senior Claiborne Buckingham scored off a penalty corner for a 1-0 lead. Sophomore Carly Grimm had the assist. The Warriors started their comeback with 18:29 left to play, freshman Lauren Thorburg scored an unassisted goal for Hendrix to tie the match at one apiece. Just over four minutes later, sophomore Abby Coleman gave the Warriors their first lead with a goal off a penalty corner. Sophomore Taylor LaFortune notched the assist and Hendrix led 2-1. Sewanee sophomore Taylor Skeen tied the match again with an unassisted goal with just under six minutes left. Regulation ended in a 2-2 tie and the two teams went to overtime. After two scoreless overtime periods, the teams went to strokes to decide the winner. Hendrix led 1-0 after the first round, but missed the next three, while the Tigers made all three to win stroke play 3-1. The Warriors out-shot Sewanee 32-23 and held a 17-11 edge in penalty corners. Sophomore goalkeeper Alyssa Havens was the tough-luck loser for Hendrix after making 10 saves in the defeat.

Rhodes lost its opening match in the 2008 SCAC Field Hockey Championship to Centre 1-0 in overtime in the semifinal round. On Sunday the Lynx faced DePauw in the consolation match and again fell 1-0. Rhodes finishes the season with a 10-9 record and fourth in the SCAC.

Sewanee claimed its first Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference Title on Sunday with a 1-0 victory over Centre in the championship match. The victory marks eight straight wins for the Tigers. Other highlights for the 2008 Tigers are Clarkie Crawford's (Louisville, Ky., Collegiate) conference-leading 123 saves on the year and Lynn Hancock's (Paris, Ky., Foxcroft) 16 goals - good to tie the Sewanee single-season record and the top-scoring effort in the league in 2008. The Tigers finish 2008 regular season at 14-6, the best yearly record for Sewanee in a decade and only the third time in Sewanee's 33-year field hockey history that the Tigers have won 14 games. The Tigers will continue into the postseason at Lynchburg on Wednesday for round one of the 2008 DIII Field Hockey Championships.
