

Article I-Name and Statement of Purpose

- Section 1. The official name of this organization shall be the Hendrix College Sociology and Anthropology Club.
- Section 2. The Hendrix College Sociology and Anthropology Club is an organization for students interested in the scientific and humanistic understanding of social life.

Article II-Meetings

- Section 1. Regular meetings for the transaction of business shall be held at least once each month of the collegiate year at such time and place as may be designated by the organization. Additional meetings may be called at any time by order of the Triumvirate.
- Section 2. There shall be one meeting each year for the election of officers. They shall be held in the spring, at a time and place to be designated by the Triumvirate. The Secretary shall give a written notification of this meeting to all voting members at least two weeks in advance.
- Section 3. A quorum for the transaction of regular business shall consist of a majority of all voting members of the organization, but an election, two-thirds of the voting members shall be required to constitute a quorum.
- Section 4. Voting members are all dues paying members of the organization.
- Section 5. In addition to regularly scheduled meetings each month, the club will sponsor one special activity, campus-wide, per term. Special events are planned and organized by a committee appointed by the Triumvirate.

Article III-Officers, Faculty Advisors and Committees

- Section 1. The Triumvirate is composed of three members of the club who have declared their major in sociology or anthropology or who have taken a minimum of three courses in sociology and/or anthropology.

- Section 2. The faculty of the sociology and anthropology departments will take turns serving as the club's faculty advisor(s).
- Section 3. The Triumvirate will preside over each meeting and will make necessary decisions with the majority consent of the organization.
- Section 4. The Secretary will keep a record of the proceedings of each meeting.
- Section 5. The Triumvirate will keep a budget for the organization and present a monetary report on a regular basis to the organization members.
- Section 6. The Triumvirate shall be authorized to appoint all committees whose membership has not been otherwise provided for by the organization.
- Section 7. All incoming officers shall have familiarized themselves with the rules and regulations of the organization as embodied in the Constitution and By-laws.

Article IV-Membership Policy

- Section 1. Membership in the club is open to any student expressing an interest in sociology or anthropology without regard to race, sex, color, age, handicap, creed, sexual orientation, national origin or choice of major.

Article V-Finance

- Section 1. The membership fee shall be \$2.
- Section 2. Finance decisions shall be left to the discretion of the organization officers.

Article VI-Impeachment of Officers

- Section 1. A member of the Triumvirate will be given a warning by other members if they do not perform their rightful duties.
- Section 2. Two warnings for any member of the Triumvirate will put the impeachment process into effect with the consent of the advisor(s). If two-thirds of organization members vote

affirmatively, the officer will be impeached,
and a new officer will be elected.

Article VII-Amendments and By-laws

Section 1. By-laws may be amended by three-fourths of the
voting members present at a meeting.

In addition to these qualifications, members of the council will be chosen on the basis of their abilities and stated willingness to assume leadership responsibility for membership recruitment, publicity, mailings, the conduct of and recording of business at meetings, and the programs and service projects of the club. Dr. Jim Bruce , Dr. Stella Capek ('99), and Dr. Karen Gaul take turns serving as the club's faculty advisor.

ACTIVITIES

In addition to a regularly scheduled meeting each month, the club sponsors one special activity, campus-wide, per term. Special events are planned and organized by a committee appointed by the council.
