Interdisciplinary Majors - Student Assessment Plan

The Interdisciplinary Major program provides students structured opportunities for the creation and interdisciplinary examination of a major course of study that is not regularly offered at the College.

Learning Goals

Students earning an interdisciplinary major at Hendrix will:

- 1) Cultivate knowledge of and meaningful engagement with ideas and issues related to the major.
- 2) Explore, connect, and apply a variety of disciplinary approaches to the study of the major.
- 3) Create written arguments based upon the presentation of evidence and analysis.

Two additional, more specific, learning goals will be submitted with the student interdisciplinary major proposal.

Assessment Tools

To assess the degree to which the program is achieving these goals, we employ both direct and indirect assessment tools:

- 1) Senior Exit Conversation: The faculty committee for the interdisciplinary major will engage the student in a guided, reflective conversation through which the faculty members will evaluate evidence of the student's achievement of program learning goals. (direct)
- 2) Senior Exit Interview: The Associate Provost and the student will discuss student perceptions of program coherence and quality, contribution to overall academic experience at the college, and value to vocational pursuits. (indirect)

Cycle of Assessment

In 2020-21, graduating INTE majors will have learning goals 1-3 evaluated.

In 2021-22, graduating INTE majors will have all 5 learning goals evaluated.
