Structural Kinesiology is a required course in some tracks within both the Allied Health and Kinesiology		
majors. It is also required for the Kinesiology minor. Rationale for course within departmental and collegiate context and based on assessment results:		
For Structural Kinesiology to be taught at the 300 level, student need to have had a solid introduction to the		
musculo-skeletal system. For Allied Health and Kinsiology majors, KINE 205 is the appropriate		
prerequisite. To make the Kinesiolgy minor possible, we have allowed BIOL 103 to serve as the		
prerequisite. BIOL 150 and CHEM 110 are both prerequisites for KINE 205; adding those 2 coures to the		
minor, however, would be impractical. BIOL 103 will provide students with most of the background they		
need for this course.
