## Take the Power Back: Environmentalism as Social Justice

As we prepare for the energy needs of the next hundred years, critical decisions lie ahead--not just for our power bills, but for the very levers of power themselves. The current centralized electrical system, in which power is generated by utilities and doled out to customers, is being challenged to its core by individuals' growing ability to generate their own power and set their own rules. This presentation lays out how the next wave of electric generation can happen and its implications--positive and negative--for poor and marginalized communities. In essence, I will argue that the American environmental movement is and must be, at its core, a true social justice movement if we are to make meaningful differences in the lives of everyday people. By transforming traditional "environmentalism" to broader notions of "justice" (economic, racial, gender, etc), we have an opportunity to dramatically change the course of our nation for the better.

## Shire Lagerdamm, Society for Creative Anachronism's Medieval Faire

The Shire of Lagerdamm is a local group of medieval reenactors who are members of the Society for Creative Anachronism (SCA). Historic research and authenticity are the foundations of this organization, and the period of history represented runs from 600 AD to the late 1600s. The lords and ladies of the Shire will present educational activities that may include scroll calligraphy, music, heavy weapons fighting, rapier dueling, period dress and herbs.

#### Thanking Henrietta: Acknowledging the Legacy of HeLa Cells

Henrietta Lacks was an African-American woman who underwent treatment for an aggressive form of cervical cancer at Johns Hopkins Hospital in 1951. Although Mrs. Lacks died from this cancer at the age of 31, her tumor cells, called HeLa cells, remarkably continued to reproduce in the laboratory, forming the first immortal human cell line and playing a crucial role in countless scientific discoveries. This talk will focus on the ways in which the biomedical establishment, and Johns Hopkins in particular, has responded to this important but ethically complex legacy.

After the contest, the food boxes will be donated to a local food bank to help fight hunger in Arkansas.

## Yoga for Your Brain: A Zentangle Workshop

Zentangle is meditation achieved through pattern – drawing. A Zentangle is a complicated-looking drawing that is built one line at a time. Simple tangles, or patterns, are combined in an unplanned way that grows and changes in amazing directions. With your mind engaged in drawing, your body relaxes. Anxiety and stress move to the back burner. New insights are uncovered along with a sense of confidence in your creative abilities. JOIN ME for an introductory course on Zentangles. I'll provide instruction on the basic shapes, lines and shading to get you started, as well as zentangle books, zencards, pens, markers and pencils. Please feel free to bring your favorite writing utensils such as markers, pens, pencils, and any supplies you love to work with. My goal is for each student to create 3 – 5 tangle cards.

This film is about a family's and a nation's effort to survive and about the political indifference of the international community with regards to the systematic extermination of 500,000 Tutsis by Hutu Interhamwe militia in Rwanda in 1994.
