This sprawling work is important for its pastiches of musical styles, allusive lyrics, and its use of prerecorded music. This album generated controversy again in 2004 when Brian Burton (Danger Mouse) created a mashup of Jay-Z and The Beatles called The Grey Album. We will use the White Album as a starting point to talk about postmodern art, mashup culture, fair use of copyright, and case studies of musicians who found themselves labeled criminals.

# Joshua Knight: "Gender with Josh Part II: Wicked Women and the Magical Glass Ceiling in Modern Fairy Tale Films"

Movies can be considered forms of culture, and we can understand things about a society through them. The films Snow White and the Huntsman and Maleficent give us interesting examples of how Western popular culture has portrayed powerful women in fantasy films and popular culture in general, something that started with the European Witch Hunts of the Middle Ages. No prior knowledge of the films is unnecessary and clips will be shown (spoiler alert!).
