### Triumph of the Will

This documentary is about the Nazi party's 1934 rally in Nuremberg, Germany. Told without narration, it documents all six days of activities from Adolf Hitler's arrival to his departure. It includes speeches by all of the major participants as well as the various activities of the thousands upon thousands who attended. In hindsight, it's a chilling film that shows the power of propaganda.

### Night and Fog

This documentary is among the very first films dealing with the Holocaust. From the building of the concentration camps to the eventual roundup of Jews and others, the films provide a view of the harsh reality that begins with the Nazi rise to power in 1933. People from across Europe are herded into cattle cars and transported to the camps where those who were not immediately executed are put to work. By 1942, the Nazi's "final solution" - the extermination of all Jews - is in full force. Little of the camps remain today but the memory of what happened lives on.

# Riddle's Elephant Sanctuary Field Trip

Riddle's Elephant and Wildlife Sanctuary (Quitman, Arkansas) is home to the largest, privately-owned elephant herd in North America. It was established by Scott and Heidi Riddle in 1990 as a home for elephants and is the only internationally recognized sanctuary that accepts any elephant regardless of species, gender, or disposition. Student visitors will have the opportunity to tour the sanctuary, visit with elephants, and participate in a voluntary work project. Sign-ups will be held at lunch on Thursday, and a lottery will determine which students are selected to attend. Students should wear proper footwear for work – tennis shoes or boots – definitely not sandals or flip-flops! Students will be outside, so wear a hat and bring sunscreen and water.
