SCAC CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Games of September 1 - September 7

HILLARY RELYEA OF RHODES COLLEGE, a sophomore forward from Fort Worth, Texas, and TERESA JOHNSTONE OF CENTRE COLLEGE a senior forward from Louisville, Ky., have been selected as the SCAC Field Hockey Co-Offensive Players-of-the-Week for matches played Monday, September 1 through Sunday, September 7.

Relyea tallied 3 goals this weekend including the game winner in both matches. **Relyea** started off the Lynx scoring in Saturday's 7-0 victory over first year program Fontbonne just 5 minutes into play. In Sunday's historical win over Washington and Lee **Hillary** scored the Lynx second goal as well as the game winner in overtime.

The win was the Lynx first over Washington and Lee in four matches since 2001. **Relyea** leads the Lynx in scoring with 4 goals in 4 games so far this season.

Johnstone scored three goals and posted one assist in games played against Washington and Lee University and Fontbonne University.

Johnstone scored against Washington and Lee late in the first half to tie the game and added two goals, including the game winner, and an assist against Fontbonne. The Colonels posted eight goals on the weekend and improved to 3-1 prior to beginning SCAC play.

EMILY BOYLE OF CENTRE COLLEGE a senior back from Louisville Ky., and MARIA COWLEY a senior defender from Louisville, Ky. have been selected as the SCAC Field Hockey Co-Defensive Players-of-the-Week for matches played Monday, September 1 through Sunday, September 7.

Boyle, a co-captain, was instrumental in both Colonel victories this past week as she locked down the right-side attack of both Washington and Lee and Fontbonne universities.

Boyle's play in the backfield was supplemented by her ability to jump start the Centre attack with her strong dribbling and passing. She added an assist for the Colonels as well.

Cowley anchored the defense from the center back and sweeper positions all weekend including playing all 75 minutes in Sunday's win over Washington and Lee. **Maria** had a spectacular defense save that kept the Generals off the board early helped to facilitate offensive play from the middle of the field as well.

Cowley, a Lynx co-captain, has had a key role in the Lynx 4-0 start this season which includes 3 shutout victories.

Centre beat Washington and Lee University (2-1) and Fontbonne University (6-1) to improve its record to 3-1. Centre's play was improved since its loss to Wooster a week earlier as the Colonels controlled both matches in the midfield led by junior Sally Faulkner. Faulkner's strong defense and possession skills allowed the Colonels to control play on both ends of the field as they posted a 58-6 shot advantage over both matches. Faulkner's play was complemented across the field as all members of the team contributed in each match. Said head coach Tom Hobbs: "Our ladies played team-hockey over 140 minutes this weekend. We pulled together to play solid defense and create numerous scoring opportunities in each match. I was particularly pleased with our ball pressure and support, and our execution on penalty corners."

DePauw dropped to 1-1 on the season after losing its only game of the week, a 4-2 decision at Ohio Wesleyan, on Saturday. Senior Beth Seegers and freshman Kimberly Trainor each scored gametying goals for the Tigers, but the Bishops scored the eventual game-winning goal with 7:01 left and added an insurance score with 4:13 remaining. The Tigers outshot Ohio Wesleyan by a 25-12 margin and held a 15-4 edge in corners.

Hendrix did not play this past week. The Warriors will be back in action on Sunday, Sept. 14 at SCAC foe Sewanee-The University of the South for a 12 p.m. affair.

Rhodes won both matches this weekend over Fontbonne and Washington and Lee for a 4-0 start on the season. The Lynx win over the Generals of Washington and Lee was their first ever, after 3 losses in 2001, 2005, and 2006. The Lynx had 8 different players, including 6 freshmen, score in the two matches this weekend. Sophomores Hillary Relyea and Lindsey Gurkovich led the Lynx offense this weekend while Maria Cowley, Rachel Webb, and Laura Deines anchored the strong defensive effort. The Lynx 4-0 start includes 3 shutout victories, and is one of the best in program history. Rhodes looks forward to opening SCAC play at Sewanee on Saturday (9/13, 11 am).

Sewanee did not play this past week. The Tigers will return to action this week as they host SCAC opponent Hendrix on the Mountain.
