SCAC OFFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Games of September 29 – October 5

SARAH KENNEDY OF RHODES COLLEGE, a freshman midfielder from Dallas Texas, has been selected as the SCAC Field Hockey Offensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played Monday, September 29 through Sunday, October 5.

Kennedy led the Lynx offensive efforts this weekend with two goals in two matches. **Kennedy's** first collegiate goal came as the 3rd of an eventual 5 in Saturday's shut out of Transy.

Kennedy led off Sunday's scoring with a beautiful deflection of a penalty corner shot 20 minutes into play in a 2-1 win over visiting conference opponent Hendrix. A skillful player with great field vision and distribution skills, **Kennedy** helps to stabilize midfield play and set up the attack for Rhodes.

Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:

Sophomore midfielder Abby Coleman of Hendrix scored three goals in two games over the weekend as the Warriors split in results against Fontbonne and Rhodes respectively. Senior forward Lynn Hancock of Sewanee found the back of the net twice in the Tigers 7-1 win over Transylvania Friday on the Mountain. Centre did not nominate anyone for this award. DePauw did not play last meet.

SCAC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

RACHEL WEBB OF RHODES COLLEGE, a sophomore defender from Virginia Beach, Va., has been selected as the SCAC Field Hockey Defensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played Monday, September 29 through Sunday, October 5.

Webb led the defensive effort for the Lynx this week in two in region wins. A tenacious and skilled player, **Webb** utilizes her speed and quickness all over the field for the Lynx.

An outside defender, **Webb** stepped up and played sweeper (for the first time) brilliantly in Sunday's game and held a much improved Hendrix offense to only six shots on the day.

Webb is a key player for the Lynx defense which recorded their sixth shutout of the season this weekend.

Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:

Sophomore defender Sarah Humphries of Centre College played a superb match in Centre's only contest of the week against NCAA Division II member Bellarmine University in Louisville, Ky. Humphries was stellar in the backfield as she eliminated virtually all the attack on her side of the pitch in open field play and deep inside the '23 meter area. AROUND THE SCAC

Centre played only one match this past week, an out of division match at NCAA Division II member Bellarmine University in Louisville, Ky. The Colonels, despite their injury depleted roster, gave a spirited effort and matched Bellarmine statistically throughout the contest. The Knights held a one shot advantage (11-10) and gained one more penalty corner than the Colonels (8-7) in their 1-0 win. Centre's defense held strong throughout most of the match and the offense generated a number of good scoring opportunities but simply could not even the match. Centre (8-3 overall, 2-1 conference) will host Rhodes College on Friday, Oct. 10, and Sewanee on Sunday, Oct. 12.

DePauw had the week off from competition. The Tigers return to action this weekend as they host two conference foes in Sewanee and Rhodes respectively.

Hendrix split a pair of games this week with a 5-0 victory over Fontbonne University on Saturday and a 2-1 loss to Rhodes College on Sunday. The Warriors stand at 3-6 overall and 1-4 in SCAC action. Sophomore forward Abby Coleman scored two goals in the Warriors' win on Saturday. The win marked another first for the Warriors with the most goals scored in a game (five). Hendrix came out of the gate hot by scoring two goals in the first three minutes of action. Coleman scored her first goal of the game, while sophomore defender Heather Newell knocked in the second. Hendrix put the ball past the keeper once more before the break when first year midfielder Lauren Thorburg scored her first career goal. The Warriors did not let up in the second half and scored two more goals to get to the final score. Coleman's fourth goal of the season came in the 37th minute while first year midfielder Liz Williamson scored her third goal of the season with just 42 seconds remaining. The Hendrix defense put on a showcase by allowing just three shots in the affair. Sophomore goalkeeper Alyssa Havens and first year keeper Jane Derrick combined for the shutout victory. Coleman scored her team-best fifth goal of the year with three minutes remaining against Rhodes. Hendrix won the penalty corner battle 10-7, but lost in the shots column 10-6.

Rhodes picked up two more wins at home this weekend over in region opponent Transy and SCAC competitor Hendrix to advance to 9-1 on the season, 2-1 in SCAC play. The Lynx played their best game yet in the 5-0 win over Transy with Callie Borgman scoring the game winner just 49 seconds into play. Lindsey Gurkovich chipped in two goals and an assist while Maria Cowley and Sarah Kennedy also scored for the Lynx. Kennedy, a freshman midfielder from Dallas, led the Lynx on Sunday contributing a goal as well as anchoring the midfield play. Rachel Webb and Maria Cowley had strong defensive efforts in both wins and led a defense that has only allowed seven goals in 10 games. Sunday's win over Hendrix puts the Lynx back in the race for the SCAC title, tied for first with Centre and DePauw who they will face on the road this coming weekend.

Sewanee jumped out 2-0 on visiting Transylvania on Friday afternoon to set the tone for a 7-1 slam of the Pioneers. Sewanee led 4-1 at the half. In the first, Taylor Skeen (Baltimore, Md., Towson) and Caroline Carlin (Gladwyne, Penn., Country Day) scored goals before Meghan Lampe netted Transy's only goal. Senior captain Lynn Hancock (Paris, Ky., Foxcroft) scored Sewanee's next two goals to lock down the 4-1 tally at the break. In the second half, Sewanee added some insurance with a goal by Elise Landau (Wernersville, Pa., Lancaster Country Day) and a pair by Liza Ketcham (Greenwich, Conn., Greenwich) to secure the final 7-1 score in favor of the Tigers. Clarkie Crawford (Louisville, Ky., Collegiate) had nine saves in goal for Sewanee. Sewanee outshot the Pioneers 31-9 on the day and took 11 penalty corners compared to six by Transy. Sewanee is 6-3 (2-2 SCAC) and will play at DePauw and Centre next weekend in SCAC action.
