### Entrepreneur Series: Sustainable and Organic Businesses

A healthy environment is an important part of a healthy economy. In this session hear from guest speakers about how entrepreneurs and organizations can work together to create sustainable, environmentally friendly businesses. Food will be served!

The speakers (in Campbell, next to the cafeteria on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of SLTC) are:

*Chris Hiryak* – Chris is the Creative Director of Little Rock Urban Farming. His mission in starting the farm was to educate the community and increase awareness of how consuming locally grown fruits and vegetables can lead to a stronger economy and community.

*Jack and Corri Sundell* – Jack and Corri are the owners of Root Café in Little Rock. Root Café is known for using small-scale, local suppliers such as the Little Rock Urban Farm, and for sourcing their meats locally. They also use a large percentage of vegetables and cheeses that are grown and produced in the region.

### The Battle of Little Rock: Arkansas, Civil Rights, and the Cold War

When the Little Rock Nine walked up the steps of Little Rock Central High School in September 1957, they did so with the protection of white southerners, the very group which had fought so hard to keep them out. A study of the military operation, Operation Arkansas, to enforce court orders to integrate the school reveals the contours of race and regional identity in the south of the 1950s.

### Gödel's Incompleteness Theorems and the Limitations of Mathematics

Mathematics is often considered an infallible and completely objective discipline, but the Incompleteness Theorems of Kurt Gödel suggest otherwise. This session will provide brief sketches of the proofs of Gödel's theorems, as well as a discussion of the implications of his work.

### All In the Family: Trends in Modern Judaism

Judaism is the cornerstone of the world's two largest religions: Christianity and Islam. Yet, many people have neither met a Jewish person nor understand that Judaism continues to be a viable and diverse religious tradition. Come talk to two Jewish guys, and find out about the different movements in Modern Judaism: Orthodox, Reform, Conservative, and Reconstructionist.

### What If I Want to Go Gentle into That Good Night? Agency, Technology, & End of Life Care

In addition to learning about the ethical framework that underlies the concept of dying on your own terms, we will examine how death exists, not as an event defined by a biological reductionism, but as a medical, social, and religious event. We will also discuss how technology functions in a clinical setting for patients at the end of life, making distinctions between the biomedical model of care and the hospice model of care.
