Riddle's Elephant Farm

Riddle's Elephant and Wildlife Sanctuary (Quitman, Arkansas) is home to the largest, privately-owned elephant herd in North America. It was established by Scott and Heidi Riddle in 1990 as a home for elephants needing one for any reason and is the only internationally recognized sanctuary that accepts any elephant regardless of species, gender, or disposition. Student visitors will have the opportunity to tour the sanctuary, visit with elephants, and participate in a voluntary work project for Riddle's. Sign-ups will be circulated in Natural Sciences courses, and a lottery will determine which students are selected to attend. Remind students they will be working and should wear proper footwear – tennis shoes or boots – definitely not sandals or flip-flops! Students will be outside, so wear a hat and bring sunscreen.
