



TRANSFER STUDENTS

Hendrix College welcomes applications for admission from students seeking to transfer from other accredited colleges and universities. We have found that the breadth of experience brought by students who have attended other institutions enriches the learning environment for all students at Hendrix.

Students interested in transferring to Hendrix are asked to complete our online request for information or contact Jennifer McKenzie, our admission counselor responsible for working with transfer students, at 800-277-9017 or mckenziej@hendrix.edu.

TO APPLY FOR ADMISSION

- Complete the Common Application online at www.commonapp.org or the Hendrix College Application at www.hendrix.edu/apply. The college has no preference between the two applications. **Applications must be received by the Office of Admission by July 1 for the fall semester and December 1 for the spring semester.**
- Have your high school send an official transcript of your high school grades since the beginning of the ninth grade to Hendrix.
- Request that your American College Test (ACT) or Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) scores be sent to Hendrix.
- Have each college and/or university previously or currently attended send an official transcript of your work. Failure to report attendance at another institution, whether or not credit was granted, may result in dismissal from Hendrix.
- Have the most recent college or university you have attended send a **Dean of Student Affairs Recommendation Form** to Hendrix. This form may be obtained from the Office of Admission or via the Hendrix Web site at www.hendrix.edu/admission/transfer.

CAMPUS VISITS

An official visit to the Hendrix campus is strongly encouraged to determine if Hendrix is the best choice for you. Campus visits need to be scheduled at least one week in advance. You can either plan to attend one of our scheduled Hendrix College Experience Days or choose a time to visit that is convenient for you.

TRANSFER CREDITS

Be sure to request a final transcript from all colleges or universities previously attended. Once a transfer student has submitted an official transcript(s) to Hendrix, an evaluation of credits will be completed and sent from the Office of the Registrar.

Transfer credit can be accepted subject to the following conditions and restrictions:

- Courses offered for transfer must be taken at an accredited institution.
- The courses must be comparable in academic quality to Hendrix courses.

- Transfer credit will be considered only for courses in which the grade of “C” or better is recorded.
- “Credit” or “pass” grades will not be accepted in transfer

If a course is accepted for credit, it will be counted as “transfer credit.” No grade points from such transfer courses will be calculated in the Hendrix grade point average.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT AND INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM

To receive credit for advanced placement examinations, transfer students must have the original scores sent to Hendrix from the Educational Testing Service. To receive International Baccalaureate credit, please have original scores sent to Hendrix by the International Baccalaureate testing agency. For further information, consult the Hendrix College Catalog.

FINANCIAL AID

Hendrix uses the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to determine eligibility for financial aid. Hendrix’s code to include on the FAFSA is 001099. If a transfer student has received financial aid from another college or university, he or she must request that a financial aid transcript be sent to the Office of Financial Aid at Hendrix. **Priority date for financial aid is March 1.**

SCHOLARSHIPS

Each year, Hendrix offers a limited number of scholarships to transfer students.

Transfer Scholarships: To be eligible for the transfer scholarship, you must have attended another accredited college or university for at least one year, and you must apply and be accepted for admission to Hendrix. Your college or university grade point average must be at least 3.0.

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarships: To be eligible for a Phi Theta Kappa scholarship, you must have graduated from a community college and have been a member of Phi Theta Kappa. The Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship cannot be awarded in addition to the Transfer Scholarship.
