Emily Cummins enters her first season at the helm of the Hendrix College women's basketball program. Cummins comes to Hendrix after a three year stint as an assistant at LaGrange College in LaGrange, Ga.

Cummins, a Springfield, Ohio native, accepts her first head coaching position with excitement and eagerness. "I am thrilled for the opportunity to be the new head coach for the Hendrix College women's basketball team," stated Cummins. "I am very excited to get started and continue building on the success that the team and Coach McCracken had last season. I could not ask for a better place than Hendrix College to accept my first role as a head coach and I look forward to continuing the tradition that has already begun."

Cummins assisted under last season's Great South Athletic Conference (GSAC) Coach-of-the-Year Mark Isenhour and was a key component in turning a sub .500 level program in 2007-08 (11-15) into a conference contender in 2009-10 (18-8). The Panthers qualified for the GSAC Semifinals last year and finished second in the league with a 12-2 league mark.

Cummins spent the majority of her time on the court coaching the guards and has proven her value with back-to-back Panther guards earning GSAC Freshman-of-the-Year awards. Throughout her coaching career, Cummins has guided a total of 17 all-conference players, including five of the Ohio Athletic Conference's (OAC) top 18 leading scorers.

In addition to her time at LaGrange, Cummins, spent three seasons as a graduate assistant at Otterbein College in Westerville, Ohio. She served as the Junior Varsity Head Coach and worked closely with long-time Otterbein head coach Connie Richardson to coordinate recruiting.

Cummins is a 2004 graduate of Wilmington College in Wilmington, Ohio. She had an outstanding career with the Lady Quakers, ending with a NCAA D-III National Championship her senior year. Cummins senior season was preceded by two National Tournament appearances that included trips to the "Elite Eight" and "Sweet 16" in 2002 and 2003, respectively. Cummins also won three OAC Championships over her four years and was named Most Valuable Player of the NCAA D-III Sectional Tournament in 2004.

"Emily is a promising coach who is ready to begin her career as a head basketball coach, and we think she is a great fit to continue the success of our women's basketball program," says Danny Powell, the Director of Hendrix Athletics. "She has tremendous experience as both an assistant coach at solid NCAA Division III programs, and also as a player, where she was part of a national championship team. Emily understands the values and goals of our College and our athletic program, and we're excited for her to get to campus to begin work with our student-athletes."

Cummins earned her bachelor's in Sports Management from Wilmington before garnering her master's in Business Administration from Otterbein in 2007. She spent time as an Instructor of Health and Physical Education at Otterbein and was also a Freshman First Year Orientation Instructor at LaGrange.

Krista Goss enters her second season as the women's basketball assistant. She was a three-year letterwinner for the Warriors and tallied 347 points, 236 rebounds, 197 assists, 17 blocks and 75 steals over her three-year career. Goss ranked 7th in the SCAC with 81 assists as a sophomore and 12th in the SCAC with 69 assists as a junior. She helped lead the Warriors into the SCAC Championship Tournament for three straight years.

A native of Plainview, Ark. and valedictorian of Ola High School, Goss led the Mustangs to a 34-3 record and state tournament appearance her senior year.

Goss graduated from Hendrix with a bachelor of science degree in Kinesiology with a concentration in sports management. She resides in Conway with her pet dog Ruby.

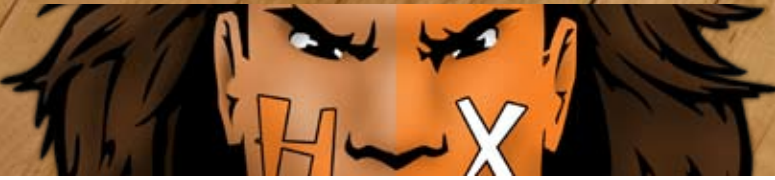

History of the SCAC

The Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference (SCAC) celebrates its 25th Anniversary in 2010-11 with countless memories of a proud and storied past and visions of an exciting future.

The SCAC was founded and began operation on September 1, 1962, as the College Athletic Conference (CAC). The league's first primary mark is pictured on the left.



Centre College of Danville, Kentucky; Southwestern at Memphis (Tennessee) (now known as Rhodes College); The University of the South of Sewanee, Tennessee; and Washington and Lee University of Lexington, Virginia, were the four charter members of the conference. Later in 1962, Washington University of St. Louis, Missouri, became the fifth member and the CAC remained unchanged until 1972.

Following membership changes throughout the 1970s and 1980s, the conference went through restructuring and renaming. With the addition



of Millsaps College of Jackson, Mississippi, and Trinity University of San Antonio, Texas, in 1988 and Hendrix College of Conway, Arkansas, and Oglethorpe University of

Atlanta, Georgia, in 1991, membership reached a then all-time high of eight.

That same year (1991), the conference renamed itself the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference, hired its first full-time commissioner - Stephen P. Argo - and a permanent conference office was established in Atlanta, Georgia. As part of restructuring, the league also adopted its current primary mark (pictured right) and adopted blue (pms 287) and gold (pms 131) as the official colors of the conference.

Membership changes continued throughout the '90s. The SCAC added Southwestern University of Georgetown, Texas, in 1993 with participation beginning in the 1994-95 academic year. In 1997-98, the SCAC added both DePauw University of Greencastle, Indiana, and Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology of Terre Haute, Ind., with participation beginning in 1998-99.

As part of a year-long celebration in 2005-06, the league celebrated its 15th anniversary as the restructured SCAC. The league adopted a special anniversary logo (pictured left) and as part of the celebration, 15th anniversary teams were selected for all conference sponsored sports.

After Rose-Hulman announced its intentions to leave the conference, Austin College and Colorado College were confirmed as the 10th and 11th members of the league in 2006 with participation beginning in the 2006-07 academic year.

Birmingham-Southern College of Birmingham, Alabama, a former member of the Division I Big South Conference, was approved as the 12th member of the SCAC and began play in 2007-08.

On the national athletics stage, the SCAC has had its fair share of success - both in terms of team championships (six) and individual championships (19).

The SCAC and its member institutions are committed to maintaining high academic standards. The member institutions are committed to the principle that a quality college athletics program is beneficial to the well-being of an institution in that it benefits the entire campus community as well as the student-athletes.

With 11 of the 12 member institutions maintaining Phi Beta Kappa chapters (Hendrix included) on their campuses, the SCAC boasts some of the most prestigious colleges and universities in the nation. SCAC schools are consistently ranked among the top 50 colleges and universities in the nation in such respected publications as Barron's, Peterson's, Princeton Review and National Review College Guide.

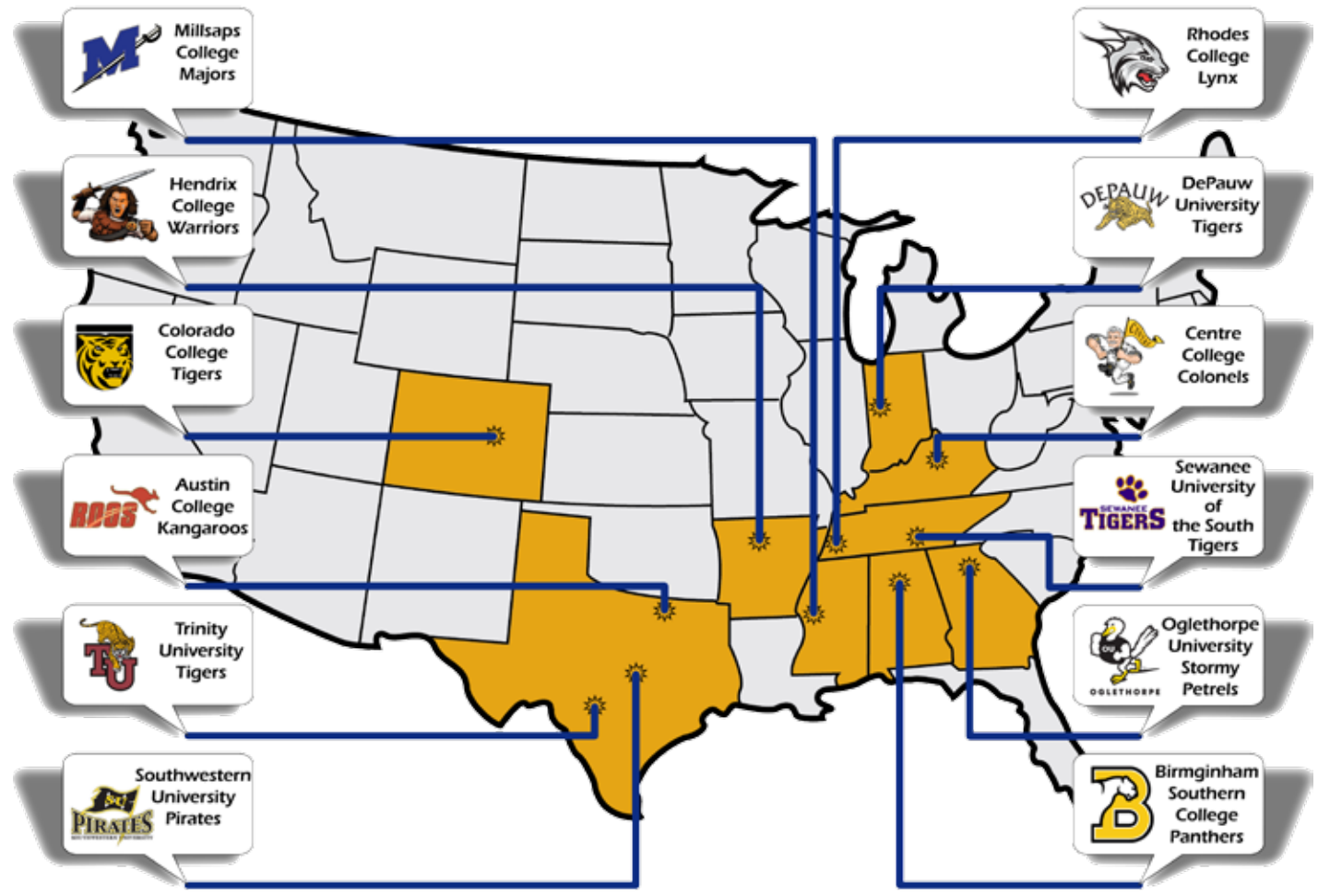

2009-10 SCAC Coach of the Year: Deb Hunter (Austin College)

In exclusive voting by the head coaches of the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference (SCAC), senior forward Katy Williams of Austin College was selected as SCAC Women's Basketball Player of the Year and 'Roos head coach Deb Hunter was named SCAC Coach of the Year. The coaches also voted on Newcomer and Defensive Players of the Year, and sophomore forward Sharwil Bell of Rhodes College and junior guard Katie Mathews of DePauw University were the respective recipients.

Williams set both a new SCAC single-season rebounding mark (13.3 rebounds per game) and broke the conference's career rebounding mark this season (1,069 heading into the SCAC tournament). In addition, her 1,506 career points places her in the league's top 10 in scoring and she posted a double-double of points/rebounds in 16 of the 23 games she played during the regular season. Williams also leads the conference in field goal percentage (55.4 percent) and ranks in the top 10 in conference history in that career category as well. Since the 'Roos joined the conference prior to the 2006 season, Williams is just the second Austin College female student-athlete to earn a conference Player of the Year award – following Kaitlin Listol, who was the SCAC women's volleyball POTY in 2007.

In her 11th season as the head coach of Austin College, Hunter led the 'Roos to an 18-win regular season – the most wins posted by the program since joining the SCAC in 2006 and more wins than the last two seasons combined. In her time at Austin College, Hunter has posted a 138-134 mark, and has a 20-year career record of 268-228. With the earlier announcement of Rodney Wecker as Men's Coach of the Year, the sweep of COTY honors by Austin College is the first since 2001-02 and just the third time it has happened in SCAC basketball history.

Mathews draws the toughest defensive assignments for DePauw and helped lead the Tigers to their lowest opponent scoring average in school history (51.4 ppg - also on pace for the SCAC single-season record). A two-year starter, Mathews averaged 3.2 rebounds and 1.3 steals per game and also chipped in on offense, averaging 8.1 points and 2.4 assists. Mathew's honor marks the third time in four years that a DePauw player has won the league's top defender award as she follows Lindsay Houin in 2005-06 and Kalei Lowes in 2006-07 and 2007-08.

Rhodes' Bell ranked in the top 10 in six SCAC categories during the regular season to earn Newcomer of the Year honors. She was fifth in steals per game (2.0), sixth in offensive rebounds per game (2.7), eighth in rebounds per game (7.1), eighth in assists per game (2.7), ninth in scoring (14.1 points per game) and ninth in field goal percentage (45.0 percent). Since the conference began selecting a Newcomer of the Year in 1999-2000, Bell is the second player from Rhodes to earn the honor. Ashley Farrell was named the league's Newcomer of the Year in 2004-05.

ATHLETIC FACILITIES

HENDRIX ATHLETIC FACILITIES RANKED 13TH IN NATION

Hendrix College has always been considered one of the country's best institutions for undergraduate education, however, according to the Princeton Review the Warriors' three-year-old athletic facilities ranks among the best in the nation.

The Princeton Review recently praised Hendrix College for its new Wellness and Athletic Center, Bob Courtway Pool and four outdoor playing fields by ranking it 13th in the country among all 2,500 four-year colleges. That includes all NCAA Division I, II and III schools.

Hendrix joined Wabash College (Crawfordsville, Ind.) and Middlebury College (Middlebury, Vt.) as the only other NCAA Division III schools to make the Top 20 list. Hendrix was also the only Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference (SCAC) school on the list.

The Warriors finished construction of their new athletic facilities in August of 2007. The new buildings and playing fields replaced the 46-year-old Grove Gymnasium. Hendrix has also recently finished construction of the new Student Life and Technology Center, which has been erected on the west side of Harkrider where Grove Gymnasium formerly sat.

"Our new athletic facilities have helped us, along with the great work of our coaching staff, to increase the number of student-athletes participating in our 19 sports from about 180 a few years ago to over 350 this year," said Athletics Director Danny Powell.

The SCAC has given Hendrix the opportunity to show off its new state-of-the-art facilities by appointing the school as host of the 2008 and 2009 SCAC Men's and Women's Basketball Championships, 2009 SCAC Field Hockey Championships, 2010 SCAC Softball Championships and 2010 SCAC Outdoor Track & Field Championships.

The SCAC has chosen Hendrix as a host school for its conference championships because of the central location in the conference, ability to run on-campus tournaments and the abundant hotels and restaurants Conway has to offer.

One of the greatest aspects of Hendrix Athletics is the affordable admission to its 19 sporting event's home games throughout the year, including SCAC Championships. Fans can come out and enjoy all the fun and excitement of college athletics for the best price of all, FREE.

In its profile on Hendrix (pages 280-281), The Princeton Review praises the college for its involved student body and accepting atmosphere. Hendrix students are quoted extensively throughout the review, discussing everything from the "phenomenal [financial] aid that would be ridiculous to turn down" to the "awesome theme parties". A political science major noted that "one of Hendrix's selling points is the personal relationships that students build with their professors," while another student credited professors for being "courageously friendly."

The Princeton Review's 62 ranking lists in The Best 371 Colleges are entirely based on its survey of 122,000 students (about 325 per campus on average) attending the colleges in the book. The 80-question survey asks students to rate their schools on several topics and report on their campus experiences. Topics range from student assessments of their professors, administrators, financial aid, and campus food.

Other ranking lists are based on student reports about their student body's political leanings, race/class relations, gay community acceptance, and other aspects of campus life. A college's appearance on a ranking list is entirely the result of a high consensus among its surveyed students about a topic compared with that of students at other schools answering the same survey question(s) on the ranking list topic.

GROVE GYMNASIUM - GARRISON COURT

The construction of Grove Gymnasium was completed in August of 2007 and plays host to the Warrior basketball and volleyball programs. The unique stadium-style seating holds a capacity crowd of 1,100. The gym also features a fieldhouse atmosphere when the windows are uncovered and the Warrior Alumni Room overlooks competition for a suite style view. The gym is named in honor of former basketball coach and athletic director, Ivan H. Grove, who guided the Warriors for 20 years (1924-47). The basketball court is named in honor of the legendary basketball coach Cliff Garrison, who led the Warriors through 31 years of basketball glory. Grove and Garrison combined for eight AIC Championships and an overall record of 721-521 (.581 pct).

We believe this new credential will be a valuable addition to our graduates' portfolios, whether their next move in life is to continue their education in graduate school or to enter the workforce.

The Hendrix Motto

"Unto the whole person" The Hendrix seal appeared for the first time on the cover of the 1898 catalog. The seal included the College's motto, selected by a committee headed by the Rev. George W. Hill and taken from a passage in Ephesians: "Till we all come in the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man unto the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ ..." (Ephesians 4:13, King James Version). Currently translated as "unto the whole



person," the motto, in Ancient Greek, reflects Hendrix's dedication to both Christian principles and the traditional liberal arts ideal.

National Recognition

Hendrix has a long and proud tradition of national recognition. As early as 1900 Hendrix was recognized by the U.S. Office of Education as having higher standards for admission and graduation than any other institution of higher learning in Arkansas. That recognition continues today as numerous journals and college guides recognize the impact of Your Hendrix Odyssey: Engaging in Active Learning on American higher education.

Fiske Guide to Colleges

Fiske Guide to Colleges names Hendrix one of 44 national "Best Buy" colleges and universities in its 2010 edition. Hendrix is one of only 24 private institutions on the list.

Forbes' list of America's Best Colleges

Forbes Magazine names Hendrix to both its top "100 Best Colleges" and top "100 Best Buy" lists for 2009. Hendrix is ranked #71 on the "Best Private Colleges" list and is #81 on the "Overall" list. Hendrix is one of only 23 schools that made both the top "100 Best Colleges" and top "100 Best Buy" lists.

U.S. News & World Report

U.S. News & World Report lists Hendrix as the #1 "Up-and-coming Liberal Arts College" in its 2010 list of best colleges. Hendrix is also ranked 80th on the magazine's list of best liberal arts colleges.

The Princeton Review

The Princeton Review lists Hendrix for academic excellence in its 2008 college guide, The Best 366 Colleges. Hendrix was among the top 20 colleges recognized in these four categories: 11th in the "professors get high marks" category, 11th in the "best classroom experience" category, 16th in the "best college theater" category, and 20th in the "lots of race/class interaction."

Hendrix is also listed in The Princeton Review's 2008 edition of American's Best Value Colleges noting the fact that Hendrix costs about 10 percent less than several comparable schools around the country.

In the 2010 edition, Best 371 Colleges, Hendrix is ranked fifth "Easiest Campus to Get Around" and **13th "Best Athletic Facilities."**

Colleges That Change Lives

Colleges That Change Lives once again selects Hendrix for inclusion in its latest guidebook edition, "40 Schools that will Change the Way You Think About Colleges."

Former New York Times education editor Loren Pope wrote the guidebook to help students, parents and counselors find a good college match. The book profiles colleges that make a real difference in the lives of students. The choices in the book were based on Pope's years of research as a journalist, as well as his direct interaction

History in Brief

In 1876 Central Institute, which was to become Hendrix College was established in Altus, Arkansas, by the Rev. Isham L. Burrow.

The school became Central Collegiate Institute in 1881 with the addition of secondary and collegiate departments.

The institute was purchased in 1884 by conferences of the Southern Methodist Church in Arkansas and was renamed Hendrix College in honor of Bishop Eugene R. Hendrix in 1889. The following year the college moved to Conway, Arkansas.



By the mid-1930s Hendrix had firmly established its role as a small, coeducational, undergraduate, residential, liberal arts, church-related institution.

From the mid-1950s Hendrix gradually increased student enrollment until it stabilized at just under 1,000 in the 1970s. Through the end of the 20th century, Hendrix added more than 15 buildings, developed a new master plan for growth of the campus, and revised and enhanced its curriculum and added faculty in key areas.

The College's long-standing commitment to experiential education gave birth to the Hendrix Odyssey Program in 2005. This component of the curriculum, which requires three engaged learning experiences of every Hendrix graduate, is helping the College build a national reputation for leadership in engaged learning.

From the foundation of more than 130 years of excellence in education, Hendrix College is moving confidently into the 21st century.
