SARAH RIFFLE OF DEPAUW UNIVERSITY, a senior forward from St. Louis, Mo., has been selected as the SCAC Field Hockey Offensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played Monday, September 28 through Sunday, October 4.

Attewell recorded her fifth shutout of the year in the win over Hendrix with four saves.

In a game decided by penalty strokes, **Attewell** recorded 12 saves and then made saves on three of Rhodes' five penalty stroke shots. **Attewell** gave up just one goal in 177 minutes.

AROUND THE SCAC

Centre continued their strong play this week with a win against in-state opponent Transylvania University. Centre scored three first half goals and added five more in the second half en route to an 8-1 victory. Centre saw six different players score and five different players post assists. Goals were scored by Mary Kate Clodius (St. Louis, Mo.), Sally Faulkner (Louisville, Ky.), Anna Fuller (Cincinnati, Oh.), Sarah Jessee (Louisville, Ky.), Jessica McLean (St. Louis, Mo.), and Barbara Parks (Chapel Hill, N.C.). Assists were posted by Faulkner, Jessee, Cynthia Morse (Louisville, Ky.), Parks, and Rachel Watkins (Chicago, II.). Centre received excellent defensive performances from Jennifer Bohnert (Louisville, Ky.), Maddie Cristofoli (Louisville, Ky.), Leah Oberst (Louisville, Ky.) and Sydney White (Louisville, Ky.). Goalkeepers Patty Cowley (Louisville, Ky.) and Cece Lindsey (Louisville, Ky.) combined for three saves. The Colonels are now 6-1 (3-1 SCAC) on the season and in a three-way tie for top position in the SCAC. They will continue SCAC play on Oct. 10 against DePauw University and Oct. 11 against Sewanee-Univ. of the South.

DePauw extended its win streak to four and moved into a tie atop the SCAC standings with a pair of wins. The Tigers topped Hendrix by a 1-0 count on Friday as Sarah Riffle scored with 7:52 left in the first extra session on an assist from Bridgette Shamleffer. DePauw needed extra time again on Sunday as it defeated Rhodes 2-1 in a game decided by penalty strokes. Rhodes scored in the game's opening minutes before Kimberly Trainor's first-half goal tied the contest. It remained tied after two overtimes before the Tigers win in penalty strokes, 3-2. DePauw returns to action on Saturday at Centre and Sunday at Transylvania.

Hendrix suffered a pair of 0-1 losses over the weekend at the hands of DePauw University on Friday and Sewanee-The University of the South on Sunday. The Warriors fell to 2-5 on the season and 0-4 in conference play. DePauw senior forward Sarah Riffle scored the game-winning goal seven minutes into overtime to hand Hendrix the 0-1 loss on Friday night. The Warriors were outshot 32-4 in the affair. Sewanee handed the Warriors their second 0-1 loss in as many games after senior forward Claire Ashburn scored an unassisted goal with just 8:44 remaining in regulation. Hendrix junior goalkeeper Alyssa Havens made eight saves on the day and sophomore forward Kelly Rappé led the team with seven shots against Sewanee.

Rhodes split on the road this weekend with a 1-0 win over Sewanee and a 2-1 loss in penalty strokes at DePauw. Sophomore Chelsea McLeod scored the lone goal for the Lynx on Friday just minutes into the second half. The goal was scored on a rebound shot on a penalty corner play. Senior Meghan Cullen had a great game in goal, notching 7 saves in the shutout, her second in four games this season. The Lynx scored just two minutes into the match at DePauw but were unable to hang on to the lead and eventually fell to the Tigers in penalty strokes. Lindsey Gurkovich scored the goal on an assist from Libby Jones. Rachel Webb, Charlie Wagner, and Lucy Bell played well defensively for the Lynx, who look forward to next Saturday's matchup against Hendrix (2-5) at Rhodes (6-2).

Sewanee picked up its first SCAC win Sunday with a 1-0 shutout of Hendrix after falling 1-0 to Rhodes on Friday. Senior captain Clare Ashburn scored the gamewinner for the Tigers on Sunday, while fellow senior Emily Detmer earned the shutout in goal for the Tigers. Sewanee is now at .500 with a 4-4 record and is 1-3 in the SCAC. The Tigers will play at Transylavania and Centre in Kentucky next weekend.
