SCAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Games of October 26 – November 1

ABIGAIL LOAR OF TRINITY UNIVERSITY, a sophomore forward from Littleton, Colo., has been selected as the SCAC Women's Soccer Offensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played from Monday, October 26 through Sunday, November 1.

Loar led the Tigers in scoring last weekend as the team clinched its 14th overall SCAC Championship with a pair of road wins.

In Friday's game against Oglethorpe, **Loar** scored her first career hat trick to lead Trinity to an 8-0 win. She scored her first goal just 20 seconds into the game, then added another in the 31st minute. **Loar** also scored the first goal of the second half of the Tigers, giving her the team's first hat trick since the 2007 season.

On Sunday, **Loar** had a pair of second half goals to put Trinity comfortably ahead in the win over Sewanee, clinching the conference title.

For the season, **Loar** has scored 12 goals and recorded four assists. Her game-winning goal on Friday was her fifth this season.

Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:

Junior midfielder Brittany Garr of Centre posted a hat trick that included the game winning goal with 3.1 seconds remaining on Sunday afternoon in front of a home crowd as the Colonels picked up a win against Millsaps. Senior midfielder Leslie Robichaux of Millsaps scored her second hat trick of the season in a 4-3 loss at Centre on Sunday afternoon. Sophomore midfielder Ashley Ladd of Rhodes scored the game-winner against the University of Dallas, finishing out the weekend with three shots on goal. Sophomore midfielder Jillian Curran of Southwestern scored the game-winning goal in the Pirates 2-1 win over Oglethorpe on Sunday. Sophomore midfielder Hannah McGrew of Hendrix posted two goals in the Warriors 3-0 shutout over University of Dallas on Sunday afternoon. Sophomore midfielder Ali Ryan of Austin College scored the game winner as the 'Roos got a big road victory over Rhodes, scoring in the 16th minute to provide the difference. Junior midfielder Julia Drummond of DePauw scored both goals in the Tigers 2-1 win over Rose-Hulman last week. Oglethorpe and Sewanee did not nominate anyone for this award.

SCAC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

ABBY BLANEY OF HENDRIX COLLEGE, a senior defender from Rogers, Ark., has been named the SCAC Women's Soccer Defensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played from Monday, October 26 through Sunday, November 1.

Blaney led a defensive front that did not allow a goal this week and picked up a big SCAC win over Austin College on Friday. The Warriors have not allowed an opponent to score since Oct. 23 when Sewanee won a 0-1 match.

Blaney guided the Warriors' past an Austin College offense that averages 18.0 shots per game and ranks third 2.14 goals scored per game. She had a busy night against the Kangaroos as the Warriors were outshot 16-7 and the game was sent into double-overtime.

Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:

Junior goalkeeper Kaitlin Elledge of Austin College allowed just one goal all weekend on a penalty kick in double overtime and got her seventh shutout of the season as the 'Roos split with Hendrix and Rhodes. Freshman defender Emily White of DePauw led a Tiger defense which allowed just two goals in three games over last week. Freshman midfielder Lindsey Euers of Trinity anchored a defensive midfield that earned a pair of road shutouts as Trinity claimed the SCAC Women's Soccer Championship. Junior defensive midfielder Alice Hilgart of Rhodes played very well in the defensive midfield position for the Lynx winning 50/50 balls consistently and helping Rhodes to earn a shutout against University of Dallas. Junior defender Sarah Holifield of Southwestern has been the foundation for a Pirates defense that was able to help Southwestern snap a five game losing streak over the weekend with a win against Oglethorpe. Centre, Millsaps, Oglethorpe and Sewanee did not nominate anyone for this award.

AROUND THE SCAC

Austin College went 1-1 over the weekend, falling to Hendrix 1-0 before taking a 1-0 victory over Rhodes on Sunday to bring their record to 9-5-2 overall on the season. In the game against Hendrix the 'Roos and Warriors took a 0-0 game into double overtime, where a penalty kick lifted the Warriors to victory. The 'Roos fell despite owning a 16-7 shot advantage, including an 8-2 edge in shots on goal in the game. Against Rhodes, Ali Ryan's goal off a feed from Shelley Casey in the 16th minute proved to be all the 'Roos would need and Kaitlin Elledge would make five stops in the net to get the shutout victory. It was the seventh shutout for Elledge this season.

Birmingham-Southern won a non-conference match against Maryville on Tuesday, 4-2, before splitting the conference weekend 1-1. The Panthers lost at Centre on Friday, 1-0, after giving up a late goal to the Colonels, but recovered to win 1-0 on Sunday at DePauw. The Panthers are now 11-7-0 on the season going into the final two games of the season this weekend. They will host the University of Dallas at 8:00 p.m. on Friday night for Senior Night before wrapping up the 2009 season against Austin at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday.

Centre earned a pair of wins this weekend at home against Birmingham Southern and Millsaps. Friday night, the Colonels scored a late second half goal to earn the 1-0 result over Birmingham Southern. In the 84th minute, junior Chelsea Stanley received a pass from teammate Katherine MacMurray and would slot a shot past the goal keeper giving the Colonels the lead. Though the match had been even for most of game play, the Colonels would outshoot the Panthers 12-4 and lead in corner attempts at 7-1. Sophomore goalkeeper Kelli Lenz recorded two saves and earned her third shut-out of the season. With Friday's win, Centre set a new women's soccer school record of 11 shut-outs in a single season. Sunday afternoon the Colonels played in a very exciting back and forth match-up against Millsaps. Millsaps took the early lead, scoring the first goal of the match at the 4'30" mark. Centre would find the equalizer thirty minutes later when junior Brittany Garr connected off of cross from teammate Amy Hebbeler. Heading into the half the game would be a stale-mate at 1-1. Millsaps would again start the scoring to start the 2nd half of play, making the score 2-1. At the 47'58" mark, junior Brittany Garr again stepped up for the Colonels – this time connecting off a pass from senior teammate Cindy Bergstrom. Centre would then take their first lead of the game at the 60'38" mark when seniors Katherine MacMurray and Elizabeth Hooper combined to score the go-ahead 3-2 goal. Millsaps would answer, however, sending the match into overtime with both sides at 3 goals each. In the overtime period, both sides would get a few shot attempts at goal. However, Centre earned the result when junior Brittany Garr again found the back of the net off a pass from senior teammate Katherine MacMurray. On the match, Centre out-shot Millsaps 21-10 and lead in corner attempts 6-4. In addition, junior Brittany Garr earned her first-ever collegiate hat-trick. Centre will compete in their final match of the regular season Saturday, November 7 at host school DePauw. Kick-off is scheduled for 7:30 pm.

DePauw is 7-7-4 overall and 4-2-2 in SCAC play after winning two of three games last week. The Tigers topped Rose-Hulman by a 2-1 score in one overtime on Tuesday before defeating Millsaps, 1-0, and losing to Birmingham-Southern by a 1-0 count. Julia Drummond scored both goals in the Rose-Hulman win including the game-winner just 2:04 into the first overtime. Emelie Johansson scored the game's only goal in the win over Millsaps.

Hendrix College went 2-0 in this week with a double-overtime 1-0 win against SCAC foe Austin College on Friday night and a 3-0 victory over University of Dallas on Sunday afternoon. Hendrix improved to 10-5 on the season and 4-3 in conference play. It took Hendrix and Austin 101 minutes to decide an outcome and the Warriors benefited from a penalty kick to take the victory. Warriors' junior midfielder Lydia Nash scored her third goal of the season for the golden goal after first year forward Ashley Gallegos was taken down inside the box, just 1:31 into the second overtime. Hendrix recorded just two shots on goal and was outshot 16-7. Warriors' sophomore goalkeeper Allison Mosley had an outstanding effort in front of the net with six saves on the night. Hendrix then matched its season high win streak of three games with the decision over Dallas on Sunday. Sophomore midfielder Hannah McGrew led the way with two scores, while senior forward Caitlin McGeehan finished the home season finale with a goal of her own.

AROUND THE SCAC

Millsaps (7-7-3, 1-5-2 SCAC) dropped a pair of conference matches on the road this past week, falling to DePauw University Friday night 1-0 and to Centre College 4-3 in overtime Sunday afternoon. Senior Leslie Robichaux netted her second hat-trick of the season as she scored all three Millsaps goals in the loss to Centre. The hat-trick moved her to 3rd on the career list at Millsaps with 30 goals in just three seasons. The Majors will close out the regular season with two matches at home against conference foe Austin College Friday night and the University of Dallas Sunday afternoon.

Oglethorpe lost two home conference matches this past weekend by falling to Trinity 8-0 on Friday afternoon and being topped by Southwestern 2-1 on Sunday afternoon. Mary Beth Horton scored against Southwestern with only two minutes remaining to bring the Petrels within one goal of the Pirates and then with only 30 seconds remaining, had a chance to equalize that went awry. Oglethorpe is now 5-10 on the season and will host Emory on Tuesday before closing out the season against Sewanee on Saturday.

Rhodes split in their two games over the weekend. On Friday night the Lynx picked up a 1-0 shutout in a non-conference tilt against The University of Dallas. On Sunday Rhodes fell in a tough 1-0 match against Austin College. Rhodes will close out the regular season this weekend on the road against Trinity and Southwestern.

Sewanee went 1-1 this weekend with a win over Southwestern Friday and then a tough loss to #3 Trinity on Sunday. The team earned its 10th win and ninth shutout of 2009 with a 2-0 shutout of SCAC foe Southwestern at Puett Field Friday night. Before the game, seniors Elizabeth Constantine (Nokesville, Va., Madeira), Lizzy Magrath (Norwalk, Conn., King & Low-Heywood Thomas), Allison Davis (Carbondale, Ill., Carbondale) and Lacy Morrison (Signal Mountain, Tenn., Baylor) were honored before the match for senior night. Bess Goodman scored Sewanee's goal Sunday in Sewanee's 6-1 loss to #3 Trinity. After a scoreless first period, Lizzie Butler (Carrabelle, Fla., Wakulla) scored the winning goal for Sewanee in the 46th minute unassisted. In the 87th minute, Faith Spencer (New York, N.Y., Hotchkiss) scored on a cross from Kabler Colhoun (Winston-Salem, N.C., Mount Taber) to add an insurance goal for the Tigers. Bess Goodman (Greensboro, N.C./Grimsley). Sewanee is now 10-2-3 and is 5-1-2 in the SCAC. Trinity is 14-0 so far. Sewanee will play at Oglethorpe and Emory next weekend.

Southwestern improved to 8-8-1 overall and 2-4-1 in the conference, going 1-1 over the weekend. The Pirates fell to Sewanee 2-0 on Friday and then defeated Oglethorpe 2-1 on Sunday. Sophomore Maria Pollifrone scored the first goal for SU, assisted by junior Rachel Gibson and sophomore Jillian Curran scored unassisted to extend the Pirates lead to 2-0 before Oglethorpe's come back attempt fell short as they scored one goal in the final five minutes to pull within one. The Pirates close out conference action with two home games on Southwestern's Homecoming weekend. SU faces Hendrix on Friday at 1:00 pm and ends with Rhodes on Sunday at 1:00 pm for Senior Day.

No. 3 Trinity clinched its 14th overall SCAC Championship with road wins over Oglethorpe and Sewanee last weekend. The Tigers opened the weekend with an 8-0 shutout win over Oglethorpe, highlighted by three outstanding individual performances. Kelly Watts tied a school record with four assists in the game, while Brianna Young had two goals and three assists. Abigail Loar scored her first career hat trick, becoming the first Trinity player to score three goals in a game since the 2007 season. On Sunday, with a shot at clinching the SCAC title, Trinity won a 6-1 game over Sewanee. Watts added two more assists to her productive weekend, while Young also had another goal. Young has now scored a goal in 10 consecutive games, which is Trinity's longest streak since the 2000 season (13 games, Becky King). Loar also continued her strong weekend with two more goals. Young and Loar have combined to score 25 goals this season, with 11 of those being game-winners. Trinity concludes its regular season with a pair of home games in SCAC play, hosting Hendrix and Rhodes. Last season, the Tigers lost 1-0 to Rhodes, but defeated Hendrix 5-0. Both games were played on the road last year.
