DIRECTOR'S NOTES

This year we are honored to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the *Candlelight Carol Service* at Hendrix College. Since its inception in 1964, the service has come to hold a special place in the hearts of many in the Hendrix community. For its participants, the service has served as a seminal experience in their Hendrix education, while for visitors and guests it is a central tradition of the Christmas season. The service shares many features with the *Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols*, celebrated each Christmas Eve since 1918 at King's College in Cambridge, England, and heard globally through television and radio broadcasts. The nine lessons, taken from Old and New Testaments, tell of Adam's fall into sin, God's covenant with Abraham, the prophecies of Christ's coming, and His birth. The carols performed between each lesson change yearly, with the exception of the processional hymn, *Once in Royal David's City*.

To honor *Candlelight's* rich history, we welcome numerous Hendrix Choir alumni as lesson readers. Together they represent over forty years of Hendrix Choir history. Likewise, several of tonight's carols have been heard in years past, conducted by my esteemed predecessors, Drs. McGill, Lehman, Taylor, Shasberger, and Fleming. These carols are historically rich in their own right, spanning over five centuries of choral music history, and conveying the joy of Christmas through unique musical styles and languages.

As we honor *Candlelight's* past, we also look to its future with great excitement. In coming years we will continue to explore varied musical repertoire, encouraging our students to further develop their musical insight and love for singing new works along with seasonal favorites. To that end, we are pleased to announce the beginning of an annual project to commission a new carol. Composers from across the globe will be invited to submit their compositions. A committee, including Hendrix faculty and choral conducting professionals, will select a winning piece, which the Hendrix Choir will premiere at the following year's *Candlelight Carol Service*. This competition will benefit greatly from your financial support. Please indicate "Carol Competition" on your personal check if you wish to support the project.
