
The Sound of the Keyboard Clicks Reveals What is Typed

Research at the University of California at Berkley have demonstrated that an audio recording of someone typing on a computer keyboard can reveal with surprising accuracy what was typed. Using commercially available recording equipment, the researcher captured audio of typing and analyzed the sounds using an algorithm they developed. Because the keys make different sounds, the system is able to make educated guesses about what key was pressed in what order. The application then applies to some linguistic object, including spelling and grammar checks, to refine the results. After three rounds of revisions, the system was able to determine 96 percent of the characters typed and 88 percent of the words. The application was effective even with background noise, such as music or cell phones ringing. Doug Tygar, UC Berkley professor of computer science and informational management and a principal investigator of the study, said the project should raise concerns about the security risks of such a technology. "If we were able to figure this out," he said, "its likely that people with less honorable intentions can—or have—as well."


