Commingled Recycling Bins:

Plastic:

Plastic bags

Any kinds of plastic bottles

Plastic containers (should be rinsed, with caps, if possible)

Any kinds of plastics (labeled 1-7 or unlabeled)

Styrofoam (only white, but Conway can sort out other colors)

Please do not recycle:

Chips bags (especially if dirty)

Candy wrappers (especially if made from different materials)

Metals:

Soda cans (do not need to be crushed)

Aerosol cans (empty first)

Metal Hangers

Aluminum (cans, pie tins)

Steel Cans

Foil (especially aluminum)

Please do not recycle:

Motor oil or paint cans

CDs

Paper:

Printer paper (glossy, colored, printed, card stock, staples and paper clips are fine)

Paper bags

Paper folders

Paper towel and toilet paper rolls

Magazines

Newspaper

Juice or milk boxes

Please do not recycle:

Sticky notes (no tape in general)

Anything with food residue

Wet paper

Wax paper

Used napkins or tissues

Cardboard Recycling Bins:



Cardboard (pasteboard and corrugated, broken down) Pizza boxes (no grease)

Please do not recycle: Wet cardboard Anything with food residue

Glass Recycling Bins:

Colored or clear, with or without cap

Please do not recycle: Ceramics Glass shards Light bulbs

Special Recycling:

Batteries (these go to the OTC)
Books (donate to the Bailey or Faulkner County Library)
Printer Ink (take to an office supply store)
Electronics (small electronics to the Free Store, large electronics to Best Buy)
Clothes (to Free Store or Goodwill)
Appliances or furniture (Goodwill)
Light bulbs (cannot be put in glass bins, take CFLs to Home Depot or Best Buy)
